The final dates for ABSTRACT submissions is June 21, 2020.

The final dates for FULL ARTICLE/POSTER submissions is July 8, 2020.

All submissions are voluntary, and all the selected articles and posters will be acknowledged on INTBAU Iran webpage.

A certificate of participatory will be awarded to individuals after the proceedings are published.
